THIS MONTH IN 4/5

This month, students focused on the history and meaning of Remembrance Day. They learned about the impact of war, reflected on stories of courage and sacrifice, and explored Indigenous perspectives, including Wabanaki cultures and the effects of colonization. We also looked at how people and the environment are connected. Students showed great interest in how history shapes our communities today.

In math, students have been working on telling time, including elapsed time, as well as fractions, decimals, and multiplication strategies. They're building confidence through hands-on practice and problem-solving.

In literacy, we've focused on guided reading groups and a class novel study. Students reflect on story messages, practice synonyms, antonyms, action verbs, and work on adding more details to their writing while having a strong focus on punctuation and improving sentence structure.

In art, students created meaningful Remembrance Day crafts, using lines, textures, and color contrasts to express their ideas. In music, we explored the meaning behind poems through listening, discussion, and creative responses, helping students connect with the emotions and messages in the work.
